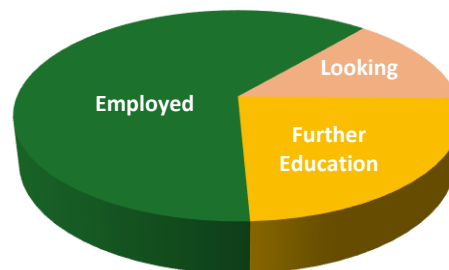


## The Career Center

### *Undergraduate Student with Future Plans Secured at the Time of Graduation*

- 86% of 2014-15 undergraduates secured their future plans by December 2015 – Up 2% from the previous year and 5% from 2012-13
  - 62% of students employed
  - 24% attending graduate/professional school or continuing education
  - 15% looking for employment



### *Student-Employer Engagement*

- Fourteen unique career fairs were hosted in 2013-14.
- All-Campus Career Fairs in 2014-2015 hosted over 3,400 students and alumni and almost 500 diverse hiring organizations.
- Over 8,000 full-time jobs and internships were posted in 2014-15.
- Over 1,500 unique employers hired CSU Rams.
- Over 3,000 interviews of students took place in 2013-14.
- 91% of the most common employers recruit on campus.

## Undergraduate Research and Artistry

The Office for Undergraduate Research and Artistry (OURA) is committed to working with faculty to provide experiential learning opportunities for undergraduates across all disciplines at Colorado State University. Educational research demonstrates that undergraduates who are engaged in faculty mentored research achieve higher academic performance, higher rates of retention, and higher rates of admission to graduate and professional programs.

- Each year, over 5,000 undergraduates are engaged in faculty mentored research at Colorado State University
- OURA facilitates customized research placements across all disciplines at Colorado State University
- OURA is the headquarters for an international, peer reviewed journal of undergraduate research that is registered with the U.S. Library of Congress and maintains an international board of editors (*Journal of Undergraduate Research and Scholarly Excellence*).
- OURA hosts an annual undergraduate research and creativity symposium that allows hundreds of students to showcase their scholarly work.
- OURA is home to the University's Anschutz Scholars Program, Boettcher Scholars Program, and Monfort Scholars Program.
- OURA houses the University's Nationally Competitive Scholarships Program.
- OURA runs several research academies ranging from the Academy of STEM Scholars to the Academy of Historical & Cultural Research Scholars.
- OURA facilitates the transcribing of research and artistry experiences through the Mentored Research and Artistry Program.
- OURA is home to the prestigious Honors Undergraduate Research Scholars (HURS) Program.

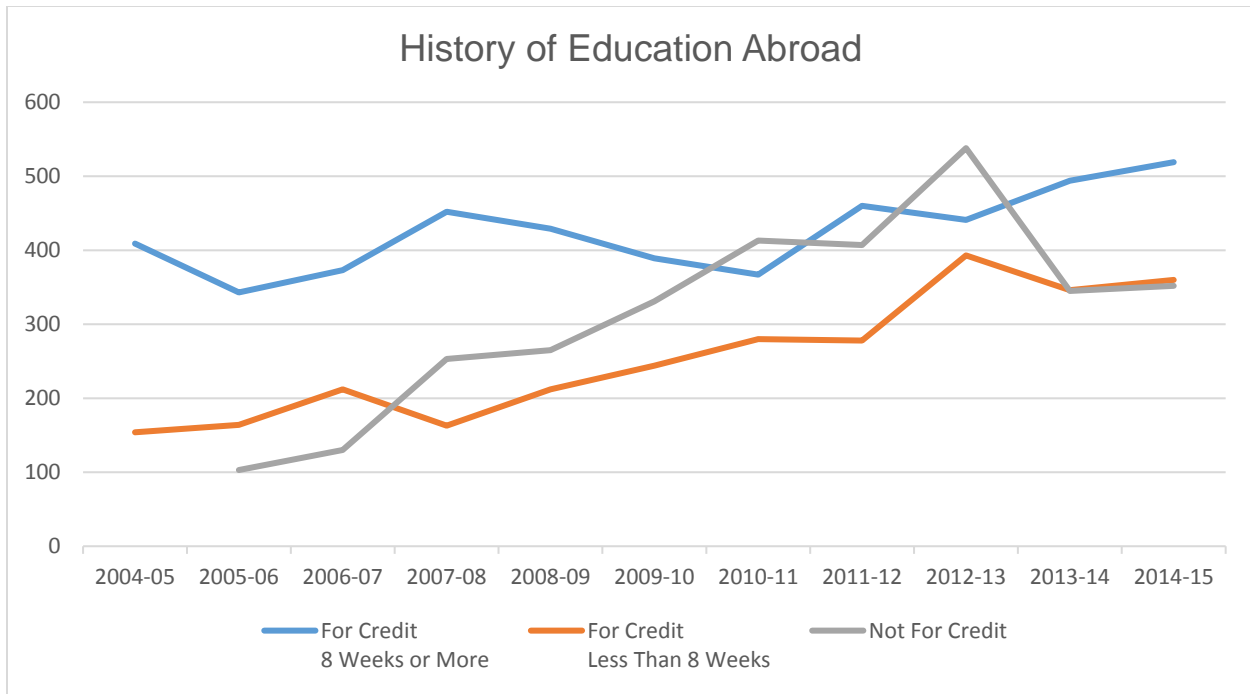

Education Abroad By Country

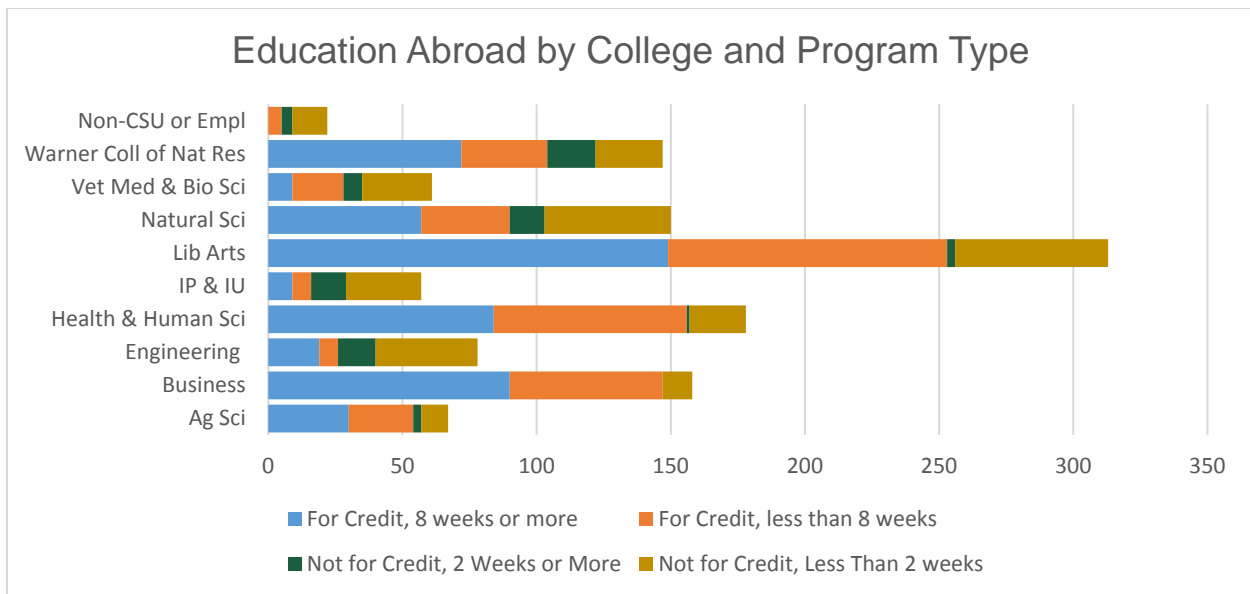
